- In the Madhya Pradesh Assembly Elections 2023, a total of 77.15 percent voting took place in Madhya Pradesh.
- Assembly elections were held on 17 November 2023 for 230 seats of Madhya Pradesh.
- Highest voting in Seoni district that is 86.29%
- Alirajpur district recorded lowest voter turnout of 61.81%
- In the year 2023, the highest voting took place in Sailana Assembly seat at 90.10% and the lowest in Jobat Assembly seat of Ajirajpur district at 54 percent.
- Voting on November 17, 2023 and counting on December 3, 2023


