







- Recently, Russia has been presiding over the BRICS countries, in which 5 more countries have been added to this organization.
- According to the report, Argentina has refused to become a member.
- Recently BRICS became 10 member nations.
- What is BRICS:
- The grouping took shape in September 2006 and originally included Brazil, Russia, India and China (BRIC).
- It was renamed 'BRICS' after South Africa was admitted as a full member in September 2010.
- BRICS, along with Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa,
- represents a quarter of the global economy and has been a major driver of global economic growth for years.











- New members: Egypt, Ethiopia, Iran, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates were added.
- The last expansion of BRICS took place in 2010, when South Africa joined.
- Importance: Development of multi-polar world order and challenge to uni-polarity by Western countries.
- India's claim to be an important leader of the Global South will be strengthened.
- It will help in raising the collective voice for the restructuring of global institutions.
- With the inclusion of oil-producing countries, the share of BRICS in world oil production will increase.

Recently, senior IPS officer Rahul Rasgotra has been appointed the Director General of Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP).

- On January 1, he took charge as Director General of ITBP.
- His predecessor Anish Dayal Singh handed over the ceremonial baton to him. IPS Anish Dayal will now serve in the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF).
- Anish Dayal Singh is a 1988 batch IPS officer of the Manipur cadre.
- He will hold the post of CRPF Director General till December 31, 2024.
- Rahul Rasgola's appointment has been made till September 30, 2025.
- IPS Rahul Rasgotra is a 1989 batch police officer of Manipur cadre.
- He has served in important capacities in the Intelligence Bureau for nearly three decades.
