









- Recently, the Central Asian country Kyrgyzstan declared the Snow Leopard as its national symbol.
- Scientific name Panthera Uncia
- This is the largest species of cat in the world
- Habitat Snow leopards live in the vast highlands (Himalayan region) of North and Central Asia.

- ecently, a ritual dance drama called Mudiyettu was performed in the Bhadrakali temples of central Kerala.
- Mudiyettu is a ritual dance drama from Kerala based on the mythological story of the fight between the goddess Kali and the demon Darika.
- It is a community ritual in which the entire village participates.
- This tradition is part of the ritual of Bhagwati or Bhadrakali worship which is usually held in Bhagwati temples between February and May after the harvest.
- Members of the Marar and Kuruppu communities perform it, applying colors on their faces and wearing large and colourful costumes and caps.
- It includes various character forms like Shiva, Narad, Darika, Kali, Danavendra, Koichadar and Kooli.











- Mudiyettu serves as an important cultural site to transmit the traditional values, ethics, moral codes and aesthetic norms of the community to the next generation, thereby ensuring its continuity and relevance in the present times.
- Mudiyettu was included in the UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage List in the year 2010 and before that Kutiyattam was included in the heritage list.
