Statue of Oneness

- Statue: Adi Guru Shankaracharya
- Unveil date: September 21, 2023
- Unveiled: Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan
- Place: Omkareshwar (Khandwa the Land of Knowledge, Guru and Sannyasa of Shankaracharya.)
- Height of Statue: 108 Feet
- Architect: Bhagwan Rampure
- Painting: Painter Vasudeo Kamath
- A statue of Adi Guru Shankaracharya was created in the form of a 12-year-old boy.Symbol: Symbol of the early years of the spiritual journey.

- Monism: It does not consider soul and Brahma as two separate but as one.

- Unveiled by Governor Mangubhai Patel, Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan
- Location:- Bhanwarkua Square (Indore)
- Real Name :- Tantia, Tandra
- Title :- Indian Robinhood



Other Points:-

- Bhanwarkua Square and Patal Pani Railway Station were named after Tantya Mama who led the revolution of 1857 from the Nimad area.
- Primary Health Centre, Manpur has been renamed as Tantya Bhil Health Centre.
- The Tantya Bhil temple located at Patal Pani is being renovated.
- Patalpani Railway Station has been renamed as Tantya Bhil Railway Station.
- Bhanwarkuan intersection located in Indore has been renamed as Tantya Bhil intersection.
- MR 10 Bus stand in Indore has been renamed as Tantya Bhil Bus Stand.












Raja Bhoj

- Location :- Bhoj Udyan in Dhar
- Unveiled By:- Chief Minister Shri Shivraj Singh Chouhan
- Birth Ujjain (980 AD)
- Capital Dharanagari (Dhar)
- Titles Kaviraj, Nava Vikramaditya
- Parmar Dynasty Kings (1010-1055) succeeded Sindhuraja.
- Death King Bhoj died in the attack of Kalachuri ruler Karna in 1055.



- Cultural and Architectural Achievements -
 - Construction of banquet hall in Dhar
 - Construction of Chittorgarh Tribhuvan Temple
 - Construction of Bhojpur Temple, construction of Dhar fort.
 - Construction of Bhojtal and Cyclopean Dam (Vishal Dam)

- Location:- Atal Park of Sagar
- Birth:- 25 December 1924 Gwalior (Sushasan Day)
- Became Prime Minister of India 3 times
- Bharat Ratna: 2015
- Died: 16 August 2018
- Hindi Poet, Journalist and a Powerful Speaker
- **Major Works-**

 - Amar Balidan (collection of statements of Atal ji in Lok Sabha)

Late Sushma Swaraj

- Location:- Town Hall of Vidisha
- Birth 14 February 1952
- Former Foreign Minister (Chief Minister of Delhi 1998)
- Died: 6 August 2019
- The name of Pravasi Bharatiya Kendra is Sushma Swaraj Bhawan.
- Foreign Service Institute was renamed as Sushma Swaraj Foreign Service Institute.




Raja Shankar Shah and Raghunath Shah

- Location: Mandla
- Gondvanshi Ruler
- Leadership from Jabalpur in the revolution of 1857
- The trumpet of independence was raised against the British in the entire Mahakaushal.
- Martyred on 18 September 1857























Raja Hirdesh Shah Lodhi

- Location: Narsinghpur
- (11 feet statue of Ashtadhatu)
- Bundela rebellion of 1842 leadership
- An 11-foot-tall grand statue made of Ashtadhatu of Raja Hirdeshah Lodhi ji, the great leader of the Bundela Revolution of 1842 AD, was installed.
- Unveiled by: Minister of State Prahlad Singh Patel




Rani Durgavati

- Location: Satna
- Unveiled by: RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat
- Gand dynasty ruler of Garha Mandala
- War with Akbar's commander Asif Khan (1564)
- The statue of Rani Durgavati has been installed by Deendayal Research Institute in the KVK premises of Majhgawan to commemorate her 500th Birth Anniversary.















Rani Lakshmi Bai

- **Location: Gwalior**
- A 21-foot bronze statue of Lakshmibai is being made.
- The platform of this statue itself will be 12 feet high. According to this, the total height will be 33 feet.
- It is being constructed by sculptor Prabhat Rai in Gwalior at a cost of fifty lakh rupees.



Lord Ram

- Location: Guna District
- The tallest statue of Lord Ram is being installed in Guna district of Madhya Pradesh.Its height will be 111 feet.
- Cost Rs 1 crore 11 lakh
- 10 Ton weight, will be ready in 6 months
- The statue will be installed on Ram Tekri, a 150-foot-high hill located at Puraposar.























Immortal Martyr Hemu Kalani

- Location: Manuabhan Tekri, Bhopal
- Role in the Quit India Movement of 1942
- leadership from Sindh Province
- Birth: 23 March 1923, Sukkur, Pakistan
- Died: 21 January 1943, Sukkur, Pakistan



- A colony named Shaheed Hemu Kalani Nagar is also developed on Ujjain Road in Indore.
- A square in Indore has been named after Hemu Kalani and his statue has been installed.
- A statue has been installed in the Parliament House courtyard in front of the office of the Deputy Speaker.
- Hemu Kalani's statue is installed at Maharaj Bada in Gwalior.
