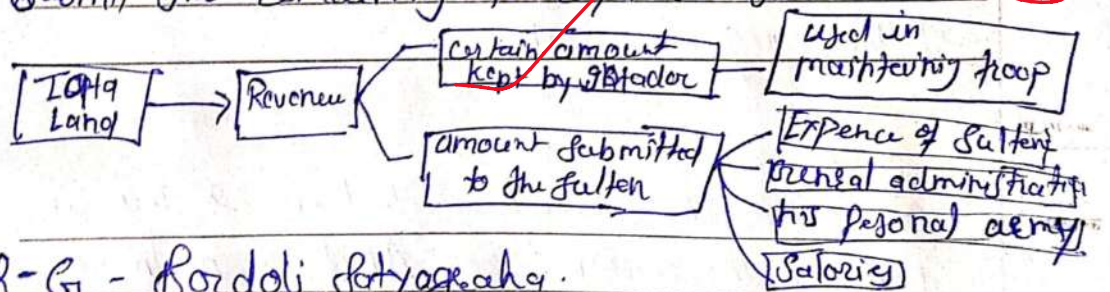

## 2-G - Bardoli Satyagrah.

- It took place in 1928 in Bardoli, Gujarat
- It was led on the ground by Bardol Vallabh Bhai Patel, Cranchhi was its "Spiritual leader"
- Cause of Bardoli Satyagrah is increase in tax by British government at the time when this area was under a favorable effect of natural calamity
- Farmers of Bardoli refused to pay increased tax.

He waged long and expensive war in the Deccan which led to denudation of finances of State

it also resulted in neglect of the NW border of the empire making it prone to attack

His miscalculation of power of Marathas under the leadership of Shivaji which eventually ruled over most of Mughal territory in future

Economic cause → Mansabdar problem → Aurangzeb showed an increased amount on paper earnings from jagir and mansabdars started to extract it.  
→ Reduction of "khalasa land"

Policy towards Rajputs → Rajput rulers who had been instrumental in side of mughals under Akbar  
→ due to Aurangzeb's religious intolerance and denying them higher place in court turned them back to mughal and revolted.

Quit India movement was started by congress



Quit India movement was started by Congress in 1942 under the leadership of "Grandhi ji" who gave the slogan of "Do or die" for this movement. It started on 8 August 1942 demanding immediate end of British rule in India. Major factors that led to the forced Congress to start a mass movement are

- 1) Failure of 2 consecutive missions and offer by British which that are August offer of 1940 and Cripps mission of 1942. Both of them denied the demand of "Complete independence of Congress and offered Dominion status instead of it

- Masses were politically charged up and ready for a pan india anti British movement due to several reasons

- due to misery faced by masses because of the wartime inflation
- Individual satyagrahs made people ready for this movement
- Condition of British and his allies was weak during this period in World War II and a faction in congress thought that it is right time to pressurize them.
- Leadership wanted the masses ready for any possible invasion from Japan, who at that time was verge of invading India.
